From onboarding guidance to project management strategies, you'll find what you need to support your extern, maximize their contributions, and build a lasting connection beyond the program.

How to Create a Project

- Collaborate with Your Team:
 Identify special projects within
 your organization that could
 benefit from additional support &
 bandwidth
- Stay Flexible: Embrace the unique skills and experiences that educators bring, and be open to leveraging them in creative ways.
- Focus on Work-Based Learning:
 The Externship is not an
 extension of classroom teaching.
 Our goal is to provide educators
 with an authentic industry
 experience, emphasizing
 meaningful and engaging work.
- Added Bandwidth: If there are projects your team hasn't tackled because of limited bandwidth, this is a great opportunity to leverage your Extern.

Mentorship & Networking

- Mentorship and Networking: Introduce your Extern to a variety of departments and teams within your organization.
- Workplace Culture and Expectations: Provide insight into soft skills, teamwork, communication, and professionalism in the workplace.

Tip: Begin with a meet-and-greet to help the organization and Extern connect, build rapport, and align on goals.

Career Pathway Awareness

The primary goal of the program is to provide educators with real-world insight into industry.

Here's how you can do that:

- Overview of Career Pathways: A clear map of entry-level roles, mid-level positions, and advanced careers within the industry.
- Required Skills and Qualifications: Information on necessary degrees, certifications, technical training, and skills-based hiring.
- Day-to-Day Job Shadowing:
 Opportunities to observe
 various roles and
 responsibilities to understand
 real-world work environments.
- Hands-On Experience: Engaging the teacher in meaningful projects or tasks that showcase the skills and tools used on the job.
- Industry Challenges and Innovations: Exposure to current challenges the industry faces and how innovation is driving change.
- Pathways to Advancement:
 Discussion about career growth opportunities, including workbased learning, promotions, and continuing education.

Tip: Ask your Extern about their goals and expectations so that you can better support and meet them.

Project Creation Checklist

- Give your project a name & objective, & main point of contact.
- Description of day-to-day tasks
- Meaningful Learning: What classroom application will be provided?
- Network Growth: How will you enable your extern to meet and learn from a variety of people in STEM careers through this work?
- Professional-Level Work: How is this work different from what you might ask an intern without any work experience to do?
- What type of skills are required for this project?
- What teams or departments will be involved with this project?
- What onboarding needs to take place in the first two weeks?
- Work location: will the extern need to work in-person, remotely, or hybrid?
- What do you hope to accomplish at the end of 200 hours?

Tip: Use this checklist to guide interviews and help applicants understand your offering.
