## Mayor McLean to code with Whitney Elementary students at CS Ed Week event Thursday

WHO

Boise Mayor Lauren McLean, new Idaho STEM Action Center administrator Dee Mooney, formerly of the Micron Technology Foundation, and members of her team, industry volunteers, and Whitney Elementary teacher Dr. Cindy Daly and her students.

WHAT

Mayor McLean will take part in an Hour of Code event with students at Whitney Elementary. More than 60,000 Hour of Code events are planned worldwide this year during its 12th anniversary, including over 14,000 around the world, and at least 95 in Idaho. Hour of Code is a global movement Code.org founded in 2013 that coincides with Computer Science Education Week internationally. Considered the largest learning event in history, Hour of Code has reached more than 1.8 billion learners ages 4 to 104 in over 180 countries.

WHY

Computer science is one of the most in-demand college degrees, computing is used throughout many careers, and CS careers are a major source of new wages in the country. According to a **Code.org report**, "Computing occupations are the #1 source of new wages in America — that's 16% of all new wages — and computer science accounts for the majority of new STEM jobs." And according to the Idaho Dept. of Labor, 19 of Idaho's top-20 hot jobs through 2030 require STEM skills.
