

STEM School Designation

- Team of 25 selected AdvancEd model
- Working to craft MOU with AdvancED detailing scoring rubric and training for on-site evaluators and support team
- STEM AC will engage with schools with agreement and various level of attainment
 - Support will be financial and in-person

FY19 Legislation

Idaho

Bill HO648

- Passed both House Ed and Senate Ed committees unanimously
- Signed by Governor Otter on March 23, 2018
- Every HS will offer a computer science courses during school hours (either in person or online) by 2020

FY19 Legislation

National

Supporting Effective Educator Development (SEED) program

- The SEED program provides funding to increase the number of highly effective educators by supporting the implementation of Evidence-Based practices that prepare, develop, or enhance the skills of educators.
- Estimated 5-8 grants of \$1,000,000-\$6,000,000 per project year are to be awarded.
- "STEM with a particular focus on computer science."
- Institutions of Higher Education and national non-profits may apply, though other project partners and sub grantees are allowed and may include non-profits with a local or regional reach, public entities, and private entities suitable to carry out the activities proposed in the application.
- Open March 21 May 17, 2018

FY19 Legislation

National

Department of Ed announced its Education Innovation and Research (EIR) grant

- This is the second program which supports the Administration's policy of dedicating \$200 million to STEM and CS within Ed
- Primarily designed to fund innovations to improve student achievement and attainment for high-need students, with a strong evaluation component.
- One of the two absolute priorities is "Promoting Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math (STEM) education, with a particular focus on CS."

- Idaho Gives Update
