- 2nd Meeting at OSBE on January 30, draft rubric selected for implementation
- 3rd Meeting scheduled for April 4
 - Finalize scoring rubric/guide and agreements
 - Determine implementation timeline for applications and awards

FY19 Legislation – Passed

STEM AC Board

- Creates staggered terms and clarifies advisory role
- Passed with strong bipartisan support and awaits Governor's signature

Science Standards Support

 Passed with both the performance standards and supporting content
