
Bank Reconciliations

OBJECTIVE 3 | Convene partners to build capacity and continued investment in STEM pathways.

- KR 1: Use the STEM experience inventory to help inform how different STEM experiences in each region can build on one another/connect to inform 3–6month STEM pathways.
- KR 2: Plan the 2023 Idaho EcosySTEM convening and invite and engage parents, students, employers, educators, and statewide partners in collaborative activities.
- KR 3: Create a local network that includes families, educators, and employers in local communities to share tips and best practices for integrating STEM at home, in the classroom, and in the community.

OBJECTIVE 4 | Coordinate existing STEM experiences to improve access and opportunities for priority audiences.

- KR I: Partner with local industry partners to build an inventory of STEM experiences and identify existing and new STEM opportunities.
- KR 2: Publish and share the STEM experience inventory with families, educators, and employers and manage timely updates.


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




Financial Updates



FY 2023 Revenues (as of 10/7/23)

Total Revenue: \$364,500

- STEM Action Center: \$122,400
- STEM Action Center Foundation: \$157,800



FY 2024 Budget Request

- General Fund increases within 3% (\$95,200) of base budget: requested for new position and maintenance
- General Fund Line Items
 - Foundation and Marketing Administrator: requesting 1.0 FTP with full cost to be absorbed, net zero impact
 - Communications Manager: requesting 1.0 FTP and \$83,300 new funding with remaining costs to be absorbed
 - Lease of Office Space: net zero impact
- STEM Education Fund: \$2 million for ARPA ESSER III, reimbursable by OSBE over FY23 and FY24
